GENERAL INFORMATION

1. DRESS CODE

Parents are requested to pay special attention to the WBPHS dress code. We pride ourselves in the way our children dress and conduct themselves. 2. SCHOOL FEE STATEMENTS

Statements are sent out in the last week of every month by email. Please note, school fees are invoiced ANNUALLY in advance and payable monthly over 10 months from January to December. Grade 12 school fees are payable monthly over 12 months from January to October. Payments must be made regularly to avoid your account falling into arrears.

Your children's safety is our concern. Anyone entering or leaving the school must use the scholar patrol crossing when crossing the road. Main Road is exceptionally busy: we ask that parents and taxi drivers not park, stop illegally or make U-turns. These are dangerous practices and put the lives of your/our children at risk. 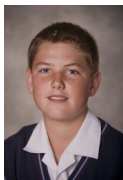

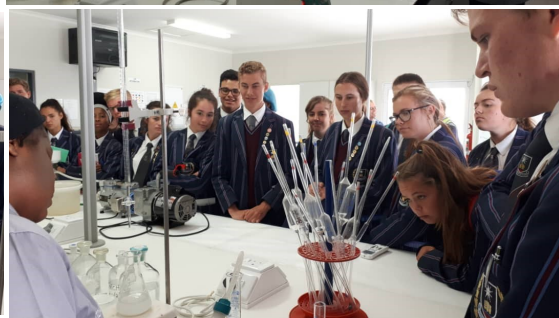
